The Letter of the Law

HeartSource turns to the Scriptures each week to find God's word. This reading is based on Mark 2 where Jesus runs up against the Law according to the Temple priests. We need laws to keep order in society, but laws do not always present the side of compassion, and love. Jesus teaches us through examples of healing, kindness and compassion. We must live our lives following the teachings of Jesus.

Voice 1:

I am in a committed gay relationship with someone I love very much. My partner and I are planning to get married, but the wedding planner I tried to hire says that homosexuality is a sin, and she can't help us because she would be complicit. So much for Christian compassion.

Voice 2:

I am a transgender student. I was struggling in public school, so my parents tried to enroll me in a Christian school, but they wouldn't accept me unless I agreed to use the name and pronouns I was assigned at birth and dress accordingly. I am feeling like nobody wants me anywhere. I might be better off dead.

Voice 3:

I live with a partner whose spouse got a broken neck in a skiing accident years ago and is completely paralyzed and in a nursing home. My pastor says adultery is sin and my partner and I are going to hell if we continue to live together. I guess if I'm going to hell, there are going to be a lot of us there.

Voice 1:

I was a member of the church choir until my husband found out I was cheating on him and told everyone. Now the women at my church won't even speak to me unless they have to. I don't even want to be there anymore.

Voce 2:

I am an alcoholic. I used to teach at a Christian college, but I was fired when I couldn't hide my addiction any longer. I wish they would have offered me some help instead of just disapproval and rejection. I want to get help, but I don't know where to turn.

Voice 3:

The Pharisees were the religious experts of Jesus' time. They demanded that everyone else follow the letter of the law, but they themselves were short on compassion. Jesus angrily pointed out to them that the law was intended to help people understand how to live lives pleasing to God. It was never intended to be a weapon used to inflict damage on other people.

Narrator:

We may be uncomfortable with how certain other people behave, but Jesus set the example, with his life of accepting everyone with compassion, understanding, healing, and love.








SEEING AND BELIEVING
